FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Dear friends,

The best way to sustain Judaism from generation to generation is by providing youngsters with meaningful Jewish memories that they will carry with them throughout life. For me, most of those memories took place in the Great Neck Synagogue or the Hoffman family home. But a goodly number of them happened on the street, Main Street, Kew Gardens Hills, Queens, to be precise. In the 1980s and 1990s, before my hometown became suffused with kosher stores and the outward trappings of Jewishness, we went to Main Street for our Judaic-material needs. Of course, there was the question of where to have lunch. Almost invariably Shimon's won out over Benjy's, Naomi's, or any of the meat restaurants. And for dessert, there was G & I, until it was knocked off its pedestal by Queens Pita. If we needed food for Shabbos, it was off to Mauzone (or once in a blue moon to Meal Mart). The highlight of the trip would be the stopover at Gift World. I could spend hours perusing the books on the shelves. If a new clerk didn't recognize me, he would wonder what a kid in shorts and a T-shirt was doing with the heavy-duty Seforim. My personal library today includes sets of Mishnah, Gemara, Rambam, Ritva, Rashba, Machzorim, and Mishnah Berurah all purchased at Gift World. My tallit, tefillin, shofar, kiddush cup, and more were all sold to me by the little fellow behind the counter.

But there was one item that I never bought at Gift World, and which brings us to the Tishrei holidays. In the weeks leading up to Sukkot, vendors of all sorts would set up stalls on the sidewalks of Main Street, where they were selling Lulav and Etrog sets. There was the Yemenite vendor, the Lubavitch vendor, the Bnei Akiva vendor, the Yeshivish vendor, and many more. I would take my time walking from one stall to the next, covering the east side of Main Street from Jewel Avenue all the way to 73rd Avenue. Only after having seen and carefully examined the selection, would I make my purchases. I wasn't just buying one set for myself. Most years I brought at least ten sets for family and friends who deputized me to complete this mission for them. In the old days, the vendors would sell the entire set for a fixed price, depending upon the quality of the Etrog. In later years they wised up; the Haddasim and Aravot suddenly cost extra, typically \$5 per package. Another change was that the vendors no longer assembled the set for you; the leaves are kept in vacuum sealed packages. Because I bought in bulk, I was occasionally able to

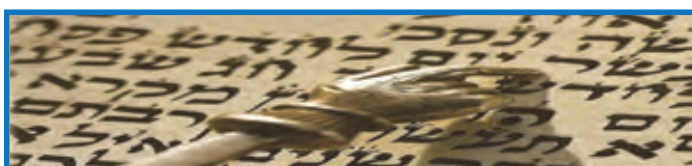
secure for myself an especially beautiful Etrog without being gouged.

In recent years, Anshe Sholom has procured Lulav and Etrog sets from a local, Westchester vendor. But for my first year in the shul (2012), that wasn't so. I went down to Main Street with Larry Heligman Z"L and my chavruta Gary Waller. I wanted them to have the full Main Street Lulav-buying experience. We had a great time, took home a quality supply, and paid a very reasonable price. When I said the Shehecheyanu on the first day of Sukkot, I thought of all those wonderful September days of my youth, when the spirit of Yom Tov and smell of citrons and myrtles filled the streets of Queens.

If I could offer one piece of advice, as we enter the long stretch of Yom Tovim, it would be for you to recall those cherished religious memories and pass them along to your descendants. If they know that you treasure a special religious memory, maybe they will learn to treasure a memory of their own.

Sari, Eli, and Elana join me in wishing you a *Shanah Tovah u'metukah*.

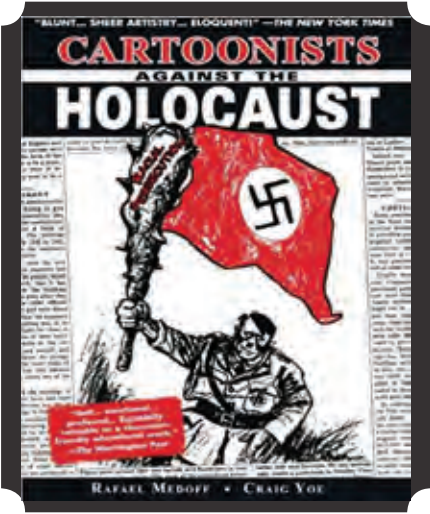

A TORAH MINUTE

שֵׁשֶׁת יָמִים תַּעֲשֶׂה מְלָאכָה

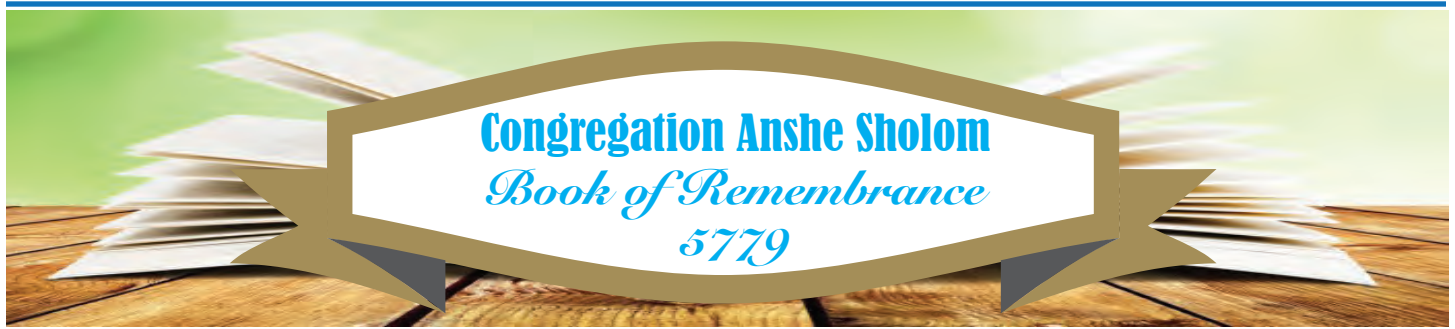
“For six days shall work be done and on the seventh day it shall be holy unto you, a Sabbath of rest to HaShem”
(Shemot 35:2).

It says in Ben Ish Hai Derushim, that this appears to be a commandment that there is an obligation to do Melakha (servile work) during the other six days of the week.

Since, however, the vowel signs on the word are תַּעֲשֶׂה (Te'aseh - shall be done) and not תַּעֲשֶׂה (Ta'aseh - you shall do), the meaning changes completely. What the verse is now saying is that for six days of the week, work will be done “by itself”. How can this happen? If a person keeps Shabbath fully and correctly, he will have the merit to rest even on the other days of the week, in the same way that the wealthy who have a large retinue of staff to take care of their matters, don't have to toil as hard in their endeavors.

This is how God rewards those who keep the commandments of resting on Shabbath, measure for measure. The only condition is that, “it shall be holy unto you”, a day dedicated to God.


