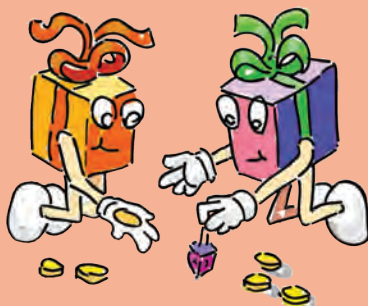

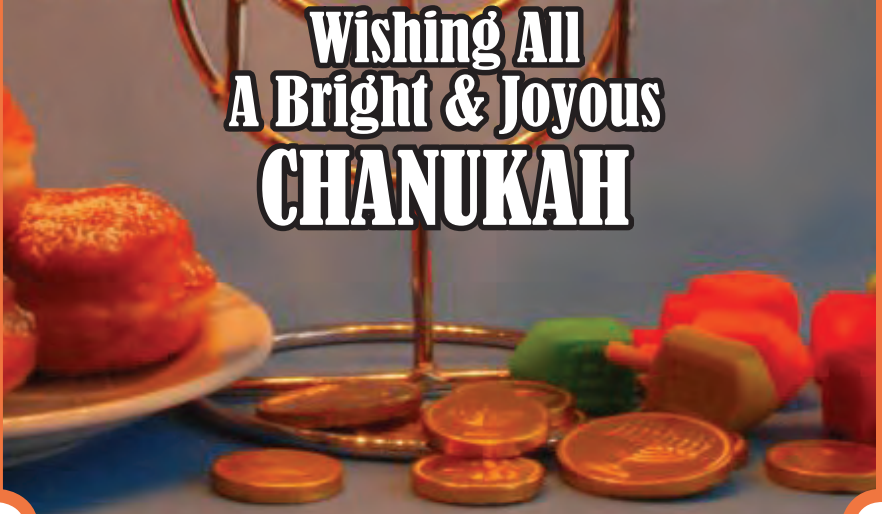

FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Dear friends,

I want to call your attention to several new learning opportunities at our shul and in the broader community. On Monday nights at 7PM at Anshe Sholom, I teach a course on Israeli Political History. If you want to know more about David Ben-Gurion, Pinchas Lavon, Levi Eshkol, Golda Meir, Moshe Dayan, Menachem Begin, etc. I strongly encourage you to attend the class. If Monday nights are inconvenient for you, you can hear the lecture online. I give the same course on Tuesday nights in Woodmere and those lectures are recorded and posted the next day on www.yutorah.org/rabbi-evan-hoffman.

On Wednesday nights at 8PM at Young Israel of Scarsdale, I am teaching a nine-week course on "How We Got Here: Denominationalism in American Jewish Life." It is essentially the same course I taught last year at our shul. These lectures can be heard online at www.yisny.org.

My Thursday evening class on Talmudic and Historical Topics convenes at 8:15PM. If you enjoy reading my weekly "Thoughts on the Parashah," and would like to delve deeper into those subjects, the Thursday session is great opportunity for intensive text study.

On Shabbat mornings at 8:45AM all are welcome to join me as we learn the Mishneh Berurah Hilchot Shabbat for 30 minutes before davening. Aside from the many classes offered each week, I would also encourage you to pick up a copy of the weekly glossy pamphlet published by Talmud Israeli – Daf Yomi for US. Copies are available in the shul lobby. Yael Schulman is the director of the publication, while I am an editor and content writer. It is an excellent way for those uninitiated in Talmud study to follow along the Daf Yomi cycle.

On a positive note, I am pleased to report that as of the day of this writing (October 22nd), we have not missed a Shacharit minyan in over a month. Kudos and thanks to all who help sustain the minyan, and my abiding thanks to the creators of Whatsapp for their useful technology. No longer do I have to make emergency phone calls or send separate text messages to different people. But we cannot rest on our laurels. Every day is a new day and the challenge of assembling a minyan continues. We do not have a large supply of minyanaires, so if you can attend on any given day please do so. As the winter approaches and the clock changes to Standard Time, the biggest difficulty will be assembling a minyan on Friday night in time to daven Mincha before sundown. Keep that concern in

mind as you make your Friday plans. Having guests for Friday night dinner is often the best way for us to ensure we will have a sufficient crowd in shul, even if others are unable to get home in time for 4:20PM services.

Lastly, I want to thank everyone who responded generously to the various holiday pledge campaigns. Please fulfill those pledges and solidify the shul's finances. And don't forget the Men's Club Kiddush Fund!!!

Dear Members and Friends,

The High Holidays were special this year. This was my first Rosh Hashanah davening at Anshe Sholom, and having Lipa Schmeltzer as Chazzan was unique and the generous pledges made in shul at the Kol Nidre appeal were inspiring. The spiritual and calendar year are both off to a great start.

Thanksgiving is coming up, and so I would like to share my gratitude to our wonderful community here at Anshe Sholom. When Jenny and I moved in three years ago, Anshe Sholom was warm, welcoming and accepting. We not only felt welcomed but valued and appreciated. I hope that everyone feels needed and appreciated in our community, since you are each a valuable member. ANTISEMITISM IN 2018

Alex Joffe is an archaeologist and historian. He is a Shillman-Ingerman Fellow at the Middle East Forum and Senior Non-resident Researcher at the Begin-Sadat Center for Strategic Studies at Bar Ilan University. He has published widely on the Arab-Israeli conflict and global antisemitism, including the BDS movement.

In 2018 'intersectional' alliances between the progressive far left and minority communities have moved a new style of antisemitism that targets Israel and its supporters from campuses into mainstream Western political parties. At the same time neo-nazis are resurgent in the US and Europe. What drives these movements and what does the future hold for Jews and Israel?

Watermarks, a documentary directed by Yaron Zilberman, tells the story of the Jewish women's swimming team, named "HaKoah" (the strength), founded in 1909. After the Anschluss, the political unification of Nazi Germany and Austria in 1938, the Nazis shut down the club. The club's functionaries organized for the swimmers to flee Austria to disparate locations in Palestine, Europe, Asia and the United States. Zilberman, the director, met with the members of the women's swim team in their homes around the world, sixty-five years later, and arranged for them to have a reunion in their old swimming pool in Vienna. Featuring testimony of the swimmers, now octogenarians, Watermarks traces the story of a group of young girls with a passion to be the best.

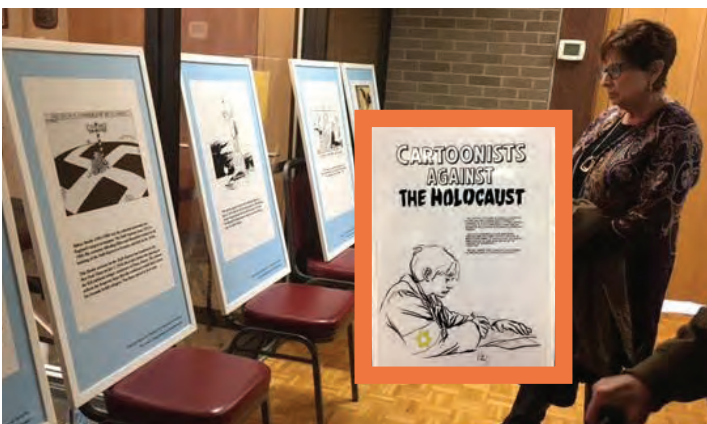
