FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Dear friends,

It is often said that the denominational divides within American Jewry are becoming increasingly unbridgeable. Admittedly, there is an element of truth to such assertions. And yet, sometimes our people can come together in common purpose and mutual respect. Three episodes in the past month are worthy of being brought to your attention:

On Thursday, November 29th the Jewish community of New Rochelle gathered at YINR for a Shloshim observance in memory of the victims of the terror attack at Congregation Tree of Life in Pittsburgh, PA. This was a joint venture of Young Israel of New Rochelle, Young Israel of Scarsdale, Temple Israel, Beth El, Magen David, and Anshe Sholom. Among the clergy invited to recite prayers or offer words of inspiration were Rabbis Fink, Morgenstern, Nichols, Schuck, Sitkin, Axelrod, and myself. [Miriam Leiderman spoke beautifully about her aunt Joyce.] This was the first time in my tenure at Anshe Sholom that local rabbis representing Orthodox, Conservative, and Reform synagogues all spoke from the same pulpit. It was a somber evening of reflection and grieving. Yet it was uplifting and reassuring to know that the disparate factions within our broader community can coalesce when we so choose. My prayer is that we are able to do so for happy occasions and not only in response to tragedy and death.

On Tuesday, December 11th I participated in Sheilat Rav at Solomon Schechter of Westchester Lower School in White Plains. The program is an opportunity for fourth grade students at a Conservative day school to ask questions about religion to rabbis of all Jewish denominations. Of the twelve rabbis participating, ten were non-Orthodox and one was an Open Orthodox female Rabbah from HIR. So, in theory, I was the token Orthodox fundamentalist. Considering their age, the kids asked quite sophisticated questions about theology, Sabbath observance, liturgy, and Biblical interpretation. I was pleasantly surprised that the answers offered by my heterodox colleagues were largely consistent with what I wanted the nine-year-old kids to hear. The only real controversy pertained to Sabbath observance, when the Conservative rabbis firmly upheld the importance of tradition in response to the permissiveness of one of the Reform representatives. Ultimately, a good time was had by all. The Schechter Principal ended the program with a joke, noting that it was the first time he could ever say “Todah Rabbah, Rabbah.”

At the December meeting of the Executive Committee of the Westchester Board of Rabbis, the board's secretary noted that a certain well-known restaurant was interested in hosting an upcoming Board of Rabbis meeting. My Reform colleagues were quick to reject the suggestion, mindful of the fact that Orthodox members of the board would feel uncomfortable stepping foot in an eatery that is open on Shabbat, sells non-Glatt meat, and lacks a full-time mashgiach under the auspices of a reputable hashgacha. I didn't need to say anything. The matter was resolved favorably because people understood and were deferential to religious scruples not their own.

In 2019 I look forward to even greater cooperation and collaboration among the various local synagogues and Jewish institutions. We don't have to agree on everything in the purely religious realm. But there is so much we can do together for which philosophical divergence proves no obstacle at all.

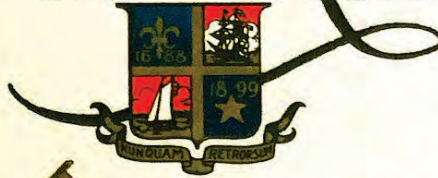

Whereas: THE MEMBERS, FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS OF CONGREGATION ANSHE SHOLOM ARE GATHERING TO CELEBRATE THE RICH HISTORY OF THE CONGREGATION AT THE ANNUAL TESTIMONIAL DINNER ON JUNE 3RD, 2018 AND TO HONOR THE SISTERHOOD OF ANSHE SHOLOM IN ITS 101ST YEAR OF SERVICE; AND

WHEREAS: THE SISTERHOOD BEGAN AS "THE LADIES AID SOCIETY" IN 1917, PASSIONATELY DEVOTING ITSELF TO THE CONGREGATION BY HELPING TO FINANCE RENOVATIONS FOR THE ORIGINAL ANSHE SHOLOM BUILDING ON BONNEFOY PLACE, AND DONATING A GREAT AMOUNT OF MONEY IN 1959 TO THE BUILDING OF THE CONGREGATION'S CURRENT HOME; AND


