FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Dear friends,

Nearly every Friday throughout February and March, I received an email from the City of New Rochelle School District Superintendent alerting me and my fellow New Rochelle rabbis about a new incident of anti-Semitic vandalism on school grounds. Swastikas were graffitied or etched into lockers, bathroom stalls, and textbooks at the High School, Albert Leonard Middle School, and Ward Elementary School. After an initial mishandling of the issue and an early attempt to downplay the matter, the authorities did the right thing and engaged Jewish communal leaders and Holocaust Education experts. Hopefully, with the right combination of surveillance, punitive measures against violators, and the dissemination of knowledge about the evils of Nazism to the broader student body, these kinds of incidents will not be repeated in the future.

At a recent meeting of the Westchester Board of Rabbis, I asked Westchester Jewish Council Executive Director Elliot Forchheimer whether the situation in New Rochelle is an outlier or representative of wider problems in Westchester County. He said that while there have been sporadic episodes of anti-Semitic graffiti in other towns, New Rochelle alone has an ongoing problem.

Which brings me to the question of why? Why in a calm suburb of New York City in 2019 is there a string of swastika sightings? Was it one deranged person who simply has not been caught yet? Are these examples of copycat crimes? Are the perpetrators ignorant children who do not know the significance of the swastika and are defacing school property simply to get their jollies? Do we have vicious anti-Semites living in our midst? Do the demographics of the city make an anti-Jewish outburst more likely to occur? Did a Jew do something untoward to foment a backlash? Nobody knows, and so speculation, while tempting, is unwarranted.

I was interviewed twice by News12 after the first and second incidents. But I have largely kept out of the matter, deferring to my Conservative and Reform colleagues who have dozens of congregants attending the schools in question.

But from my limited involvement I have noticed one important generational distinction in the way local Jews have reacted to the swastikas. The clergy and the old guard leadership see the swastika as a symbol of Nazism, horrific evil, and Jew-hatred. For them, it is a symbol that evokes fear. By contrast, the children see the swastika as an ethnic slur, a profanity, a reason for the perpetrator to "get into trouble," but not something that evokes fear. On the one hand, the mild instinctive reaction on the part of young Jews is a positive testament to the integrated nature of our community, the general sense of security that we enjoy, and the objective reality that we are dealing with nothing more than petty vandalism. On the other hand, it is an unfortunate testament to the relative ignorance of our young people about man's potential for cruelty and barbarism only 75 years after the Shoah.

We are now observing the period of Sefirah. The mourning practices (no weddings, live music, haircuts) are attributed to the sadness felt by our people after the loss of Rabbi Akiva's thousands of disciples. A more contemporary justification for preserving the Sefirah prohibitions is in mourning of the martyrs of the Shoah. When a marginal Jew asked his/her rabbi to officiate at a Spring wedding and the rabbi forces a date change because of some obscure reason related to second century CE carnage, the couple is left annoyed. If the rabbi were to say that it is commemoration of the Holocaust, the couple would be less disgruntled with the clergy and the memory of the Shoah would find a solemn place in the minds of Jews otherwise apt to forget.

I pray for a day when sinister, contemporary reminders of past genocide no longer can be seen in our fine town.





When praying the Amidah, one's feet must be in the correct position, which is together and level. We stand like the Angels with one leg.

One explanation for why we must stand like this is because when we stand in this manner, it is as if our legs are tied together and we are unable to walk or take any steps. As such, we are able to put all our thoughts into praying to G-d, correctly, word by word, without skipping letters or words, and can pray to Him with our full intent.

If one transgressed and did not have one's feet together during the Amidah, there is an opinion that he must repeat the Amidah. However, in practice we hold that we do not repeat and that we have fulfilled our obligation with the prayer that was prayed.
