FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Dear friends,

I am happy to report that, as of the end of February, a majority of our synagogue members have been vaccinated. Hopefully, as the pandemic subsides, more of our congregants will be able to return to a semblance of normal life, including full participation in shul activities. But, for the time being, we still need to be cautious and avoid reckless communal behavior. Sadly, there will be no communal Seder this year.

And yet, I think it is important that this Passover not be a repeat of last Passover. Last April, when Covid-19 was new and mysterious and ravaging the New York Jewish community, many corners were cut with regard to Passover preparations and in the observance of holiday rituals. Those were necessary and appropriate leniencies in a dangerous and chaotic time. I worry, though, that if two consecutive Passovers are observed in a far less than optimal manner, our children will miss out on some of the most important childhood religious experiences.

When I was in kindergarten in April 1987, my mother took me to Gift World Judaica store on Main Street in Kew Gardens Hills. She bought me a recently published children's book by Yeshara Gold, titled: "Just a Week to Go: One Boy's Pesach Preparations in Jerusalem's Old City". The book is about a five-year-old boy named Raffi who lives with his family in a six-hundred-year-old house in the Jewish Quarter of the Old City. Raffi spent the week before Pesach assisting his parents in readying the household for the upcoming holiday. He blew crumbs out of the pages of the seforim on his bookshelf. He took the remnants of his chametz to the neighborhood bonfire on Erev Pesach. He accompanied his father to a siyyum on the Fast of the Firstborn. He took a trip to the local matzah bakery and helped knead the dough into flat circular pieces. He made raisin wine to be used for the four cups. And then, on the big night, Raffi asked the Four Questions and found the Afikoman. It's a feelgood story that I reread every year throughout my childhood and adolescence as a way of sparking the Passover spirit within me. The story of little Raffi made me want to haul the Passover dishes from the basement, set the table, peel the eggs, prepare the charoset, and grate the horseradish.

I implore everyone to make sure that this Passover is more than just a slipshod affair. Even if you cannot assemble the entire family around the dining table, you can still invest the time and effort into making Pesach 5781 a meaningful experience. Clean your home, kasher your kitchen, search for and burn the chametz, sing the Seder songs (all of them), study the meaning of the Haggadah, eat the ceremonial foods, and impart Judaic

wisdom and historical memory to the next generation. If you plan to be home in New Rochelle, please do join us for services during the holiday. We will recite the Prayer for Dew on the first day of Yom Tov and Yizkor on the eighth day of Yom Tov. Don't forget to send in your sale of chametz forms. Flori is eager to buy your Cheerios.

Fast of the First Born (תענית בכורות) — On the Eve of Passover it is customary for firstborn males to fast in remembrance of the Plague of the Firstborn. While the Egyptians perished, the Israelite firstborn were spared by God. The tradition in most communities is to offer the firstborn a way of exempting themselves from this fast. A celebratory Siyyum is made upon the conclusion of a tractate of Talmud. This is followed by a meal to which the firstborn are invited to participate. When Erev Pesach occurs on Shabbat, the fast is observed on the preceding Thursday. Accordingly, this year, there will be a siyyum after morning services on Thursday, March 25th.

Search for Chametz (בדיקת חמץ) — On Thursday night, March 25th we search our homes for chametz. Customarily we use a candle, feather, and spoon. For safety reasons it may be preferred to use a flashlight instead of a candle. This is intended to be a thorough and serious search of all locations where chametz might possibly be found. If the home was previously cleaned and there is no expectation to find any chametz, it is advised to “plant” ten small pieces of bread throughout the house. The search begins with a blessing: **ברוך אתה ה' אלקינו מלך העולם אשר קדשנו במצותיו וצונו על בעור חמץ.** When the search is concluded, all chametz that has been collected should be stored in a safe location in advance of burning it the next day. A declaration is made in Aramaic or English stating that all chametz that we do not know about should be considered ownerless like the dust of the earth.

Burning of the Chametz (בעור חמץ) — On Friday morning, March 26th we burn the chametz found during the previous evening's search. It is preferable for this act of burning to take place during the fifth halakhic hour of the day, approximately 11:00AM.

Erev Pesach (ערב פסח) On the day before Passover, it is forbidden to own chametz after the fifth halakhic hour of the day. It is forbidden to eat chametz after the fourth hour of the day. Because, this year, Erev Pesach is on Shabbat when the ceremonial burning of the chametz cannot be done, it is important to remember to stop eating chametz at the appropriate time and to say the formal declaration that you consider all chametz in your possession to be like the dust of the earth. For Shabbat lunch it is forbidden to use challah. It is also forbidden to eat regular matzah throughout the entirety of Erev Pesach. Accordingly, it is acceptable to use Egg Matzah as the “bread” at lunchtime. It is forbidden to eat any kind of substantial meal on Erev Pesach after 4:00PM so that one will have an appetite for the Seder foods.

Latest time to eat chametz: 10:56AM

Latest time to own chametz: 11:58AM

Sale of Chametz (מכירת חמץ): For several centuries it has been customary to sell non-perishable chametz products to a non-Jew before Passover, with the foreknowledge that the sale will be undone immediately after Passover. This sale is legally binding in both Jewish and civil law. Accordingly, it should be treated seriously and not viewed as a legal fiction. Congregants are advised to fill out an authorization form granting Rabbi Hoffman the power of attorney to affect the necessary transaction. The sale will take place in the afternoon on Friday, March 26th and be effective as of the following morning at 11:00AM. If you will be in a different time zone on Erev Pesach please indicate as such on the authorization form, as this might necessitate a separate sale.

Ma'ot Chittim (מעות חטים) — We are obligated to give charity before the holiday so as to ensure that indigent Jews will be supplied with their holiday needs. Literally, this concept can be translated as “coins for wheat.” All Jews, even those on lowest rung of the socioeconomic ladder, must be given wine, matzah, and other Kosher for Passover essentials. You can fulfill this obligation by donating to the Anshe Sholom Passover Fund. Your charitable contribution will help feed Jews in Israel and New York.

SALE OF CHAMETZ FORM

I _____ hereby authorize Rabbi Evan Hoffman (50 North Ave New Rochelle, NY 10805), to sell or transfer all of my chametz (as defined by Torah and rabbinic law) in advance of Passover 5781. I also authorize him to rent, for the duration of Passover, the premises occupied by such chametz.
