

Dear friends,

The holidays are early this year. As I write this column, though there is still more than a week left in August, I am already listening to recordings of Selichot and the Nusach of Yamim Noraim in preparation for High Holiday services. As of now, our plan is to have only one minyan, indoors. Seating will be socially distanced in the ballroom, while family units will be able to sit together in the Sanctuary pews. Rabbi Kracko will lead us in Shacharit and David Reitberger will daven Musaf. All congregants need to wear masks covering their mouth and nose. All congregants need to be vaccinated, or submit a negative PCR test within 3 days of Yom Tov. We anticipate having a Children's Service on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur in the tent. There will be an extra round of Shofar blowing in the tent upon the conclusion of Rosh Hashanah davening. There will also be Shofar blowing at Tashlich in Hudson Park. Please join me for the Shabbat Shuva Drasha. My topic will be "Beauty & Brutality: Kapparot (and Judaism) in the Eye of the Beholder."

On Yom Kippur, we expect to have a long break in between Musaf and Mincha. I encourage everyone to participate in the lengthy learning session on Yom Kippur afternoon. It is an intellectually stimulating and spiritually meaningful session, in addition to helping break up the long afternoon. If you would like to buy a Lulav & Etrog set through the shul, please let me know by September 6th. Pickup will be on Sunday morning, September 19th 9-11AM. We hope to have a very joyous Sukkot at Anshe Sholom, with Kiddushes each Yom Tov day and a Sisterhood Sukkah Dinner. Simchat Torah services will be held in the tent to accommodate the children and to facilitate dancing.


I am happy to announce that Yochai & Meitav Feldman and their children have moved into the neighborhood. The Feldmans are Shlichim from Israel. They will be teaching at Westchester Day School and running our Youth Department. In the coming weeks, I encourage all of our shul's young families to bring their children to outdoor children's services on Shabbat mornings. Yochai and Meitav will also be bringing Israel-themed and Hebrew-language programming to Anshe Sholom. We look forward to benefiting from their presence in the community.

Saturday, September 11th is the 20th anniversary of the attack on the World Trade Center. Every year, I represent the New Rochelle Jewish community at the 9/11 Vigil run by the local VFW at the American Legion. This year, the event will take place on the lawn of City Hall at 7:30PM. I strongly encourage you to attend. Shabbat ends early enough for us to make the second half of the program, and Peter Parente was kind enough to accommodate my Shabbat observance by scheduling me as the final speaker. It is always a solemn and meaningful program and a moment of interreligious solidarity.

I encourage everyone to partake of our Torah study classes. Daf Yomi continues every day on Zoom. We are currently learning Masekhet Sukkah. The Chumash class is on Thursdays at 8:15PM. We recently started a new class on Rambam's Mishneh Torah on Shabbat mornings at 8:30AM. We are currently learning the Laws of Kings. The Jewish History class will resume on Mondays 7PM after Simchat Torah. This year's course will be "The History of Anti-Semitism." Recordings of the history class will also be available on YUTORAH.ORG. Rabbi Kracko's class on the weekly parashah continues via Zoom, Wednesdays at 7:00 PM.





RABBI EVAN HOFFMAN—Adding Time to the Sacred: Mom Kippur Style

There is a mitzvah to add time to Shabbat at both the beginning and end of the day. This is accomplished by lighting candles and accepting the sanctity of the Sabbath eighteen minutes (or some other length of time) prior to sunset, and by delaying Havdalah until some length of time after darkness has descended. This obligation also applies to holidays. The Torah itself alludes to this requirement in stating that Yom Kippur extends from evening until evening, beginning on 9 Tishri. Since Yom Kippur is, in fact, observed on 10 Tishri, the implication of the Biblical passage is that observance of sacred time should commence while it is still 9 Tishri prior to sundown.

The obligation of adding to sacred time led to the development of several customs observed on the eve of Yom Kippur. Firstly, we stop eating well before sunset. Secondly, the ladies light candles even earlier than they would for a typical Shabbat. Thirdly, we begin the Kol Nidre service while it is still daytime. Since Kol Nidre has a quasi-judicial flavor to it, we must begin its recitation before sundown, being that courts do not function at night. Fourthly, the men put on a Tallit for the Maariv service, and are able to recite a blessing over the Tallit because the custom is being observed while still technically daytime.

At the end of Yom Kippur, there is no popular will to extend the sacred time any longer than necessary given that people are hungry from the fast. Nonetheless, Havdalah is not recited after Ne'ilah. Rather, it is recited after Maariv, usually several minutes after the stars appear. In some synagogues, the shofar is not blown until after Havdalah, further extending an element of Yom Kippur's sanctity a little while longer.
