## FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Dear friends,

In the depths of winter, when the oppressive wind and cold take a toll on one's emotional (and physical) state, it is important to have a place and an activity that provides warmth (in both the figurative and literal senses). I wake up each weekday morning at 6:00AM in order to get Eli ready for the Frisch high school van that picks him up at 6:30AM. At that hour, it is still dark out. I spend the next half hour getting some exercise by taking a vigorous walk up and down the North Ave hill several times.

A few minutes before 7:00AM, I enter the side door of Anshe Sholom and make my way to the Librett Chapel for morning minyan. That room is the place where I find spiritual warmth. (And, in recent months, physical warmth too, as the baseboard heating has been functioning optimally.) I say "good morning" to those who arrived early, put on my Tallit and Tefillin, switch on the Menorah light above the chazzan's stand, and open up the oversized chazzan's Siddur. For the next thirty minutes (and on Mondays and Thursdays, forty minutes) I lead the congregation in heartfelt prayer.

The regular minyanaires have long ago learned the nuances of my nussach (cantorial melody). They join in with me as I recite aloud the final line of the outgoing paragraph and the opening line of the next paragraph. They know how I switch from modern Hebrew pronunciation to old-world Ashkenazi pronunciation for the final line of the long Tachanun. They get excited as I belt out the opening word of the "second" Ashrei. And, on Fridays, they anticipate my immediate post-davening remark, "Good news, Shabbos is coming, candle lighting is at 4:13PM."

While any recurring social gathering can foster a sense of camaraderie, the minyan truly brings people together. On the rare morning that I find myself davening somewhere other than Anshe Sholom, I miss my chaverim, and I miss that special place. I can only hope that more people will discover the emotional, psychological, and spiritual advantages of attaching oneself to a daily minyan. Communing with one's Maker and fulfilling the religious command of reciting the statutory liturgy bring a person into the room; enjoying the environment and feeling at home are what keep people coming back.

I want to appeal to everyone to increase their participation in our regular Shabbat activities. I am looking for volunteers to deliver a Friday night Dvar Torah, read an Aliyah or Haftorah on Shabbat morning, and to serve as Chazzan for Shacharit or Mussaf. I thank those who have volunteered in recent weeks. Your voices enhance our services.
